YOUR NEWS FROM AROUND THE FEDERATION

Members of **Caistor WI** enjoyed a glass of Buck's Fizz with a toast to the New Year at the beginning of their January meeting. Afterwards they had fun participating in a fun auction with Ann Hamilton acting as auctioneer. Members brought a variety of items to be auctioned off, including unwanted Christmas gifts. The auctioned items included, chocolates, candles, a jumper, slippers, mugs, gin, toiletries, games, and a calendar to name a few. The auction raised £69.50 for the WI funds.

Afterwards, everyone enjoyed a sweet and savoury buffet. All agreed it had been an excellent opportunity to socialise and was a good start to 2024.

South Elkington welcomed Vivien Gill to the January meeting, who gave a very informative and enjoyable talk on sign language. Vivien explained that Makaton was easier to use than British Sign Language as the former signs were shorter, making communication easier and she also stressed the importance of facial expression. Members were taught several signs including being able to say please and thank you, and how to request a cup of tea or coffee, a slice of cake or a glass of wine! Vivien also explained how her cochlea implant worked.

Horncastle WI: In January, we had Linda Coatsworth who showed us how to make a 2 or 3 tier cake stand and then those of us who wanted to, had a chance to make our



Washingborough WI's speaker was Kenneth Moore. His subject was 'The Dicken Medal/Victoria Cross'. These are awarded to animals for their gallantry and bravery during conflicts of war and traumatic events.

Together with a Power Point presentation, Kenneth described vivid examples of dedication and fearlessness of a variety of animals who went beyond the call of duty to fulfill their mission. Medals were awarded through the second World War and continue to the present day. An intriguing and riveting presentation. **Wragby Wi's** speaker was Terry Carpenter "My life as a custody officer". Terry gave us a brief run down on his career and how he became a custody officer in 1984. He went on to explain about PACE, the act police officers must adhere to in order to bring a case.

Terry informed us there are 1608 notifiable offences. He then gave us examples of cases he had been involved in before his retirement 11 years ago.

Terry was a very informative, funny at times and an interesting speaker.

Members of **Nettleham WI** enjoyed an evening of cakes and games at their first meeting of the new year. There were no prizes, but everyone chose something from the Lucky Dip bag at the end of the session. And, the cakes were delicious!

Members of **Hagworthingham & District WI** had a visit from "Laurelbank Queen Victoria", a 17 hands high Shire horse in January. Jo Boulderstone of Barnsbridge Shires spoke with great good humour about Shire horses, their history, showing and the Shire Horse Trust.

It was a fascinating and most unusual afternoon.



THE WI LEARNING HUB NEWS

The WI Learning Hub was launched on 24th January. £2.75 million of the Denman sale proceeds are to be used for phase 1 of the initiative. This will fund the new education model which will include online, flexible learning accessible to all members, this enables the advancement of education of women.

The majority of these courses will be free and will be delivered in a variety of formats: there will be daily live courses but also pre-recorded ones so that members can access them at their leisure. There will be downloadable, printable resources from crafts to cookery, plus well-being, quizzes and compe-
