#### Resolution meeting Dental Health Matters

22 members from our federation enjoyed an interesting and informative talk on 'Dental Health Matters' from Kenneth Hume.

Kenny is a practising dentist and orthodontist at a thriving practice in Lincoln and is also chair of the local dental committee and the Oral health alliance group. He said he was delighted to speak and represent the dentist's role within the NHS.

Kenny touched on the history of dental care, from the conception of the NHS to the present day, citing that people live longer and possibly keep their own teeth.

He recognised that poor diet and deprivation are main factors in tooth decay and said that only half of Lincolnshire has fluoride in the water!

On a more positive note, the Integrated Care Board (ICB) have developed a plan looking at the dental provision. We will watch this space!!!


Perhaps you have been suffering from a health condition for years with-
